Career Coach helps you explore your future! Discover regional labor market information, explore occupations and career options, check wages and employment projections, and view related job postings. You can also see which Sierra College programs align with your interests.

### Getting Started

1. Go to: <http://sierracollege.emsicc.com>
2. New to Career Coach? Click **“Sign Up”** in the top right corner with your **Sierra College email**. Already have an account? Just **log in**.
  - a. **Add** Sierra College as your current school
  - b. Creating an account is **optional** – but without one, your results and searches won’t be saved.
3. Select **Match My Interests** and take the career assessment(s).
  - a. Quick start Assessment (6 questions)
  - b. Detailed Assessment (60 questions)

### Explore Careers

1. Select the **Careers tab** at the top of the page to explore career areas and opportunities.
2. Click the down arrow under **Career Navigation** to choose a field of interest, or click **“View Career Area Details”** on a tile that interests you.
3. Scroll to find a career you want to explore.
4. Select **“Career Details”** to see information about that specific career, including wages, employment projections, similar careers, and live job postings.

### Best Practices

- Each career is linked to a specific program at **Sierra College**.
- Find out which **degree, certificate, or course** can help you reach your goal.
- Use **filters** to narrow your search by education level, salary, or job outlook, saving time and helping you focus on achievable goals.
- **Save careers** to your profile to build a career “shortlist” and compare options later.
- **Explore unfamiliar industries or job titles** to uncover hidden or non-obvious opportunities.
- **Ask a counselor** about transfer pathways. Some careers require a bachelor’s degree or higher – meet with an academic counselor to explore university programs.
